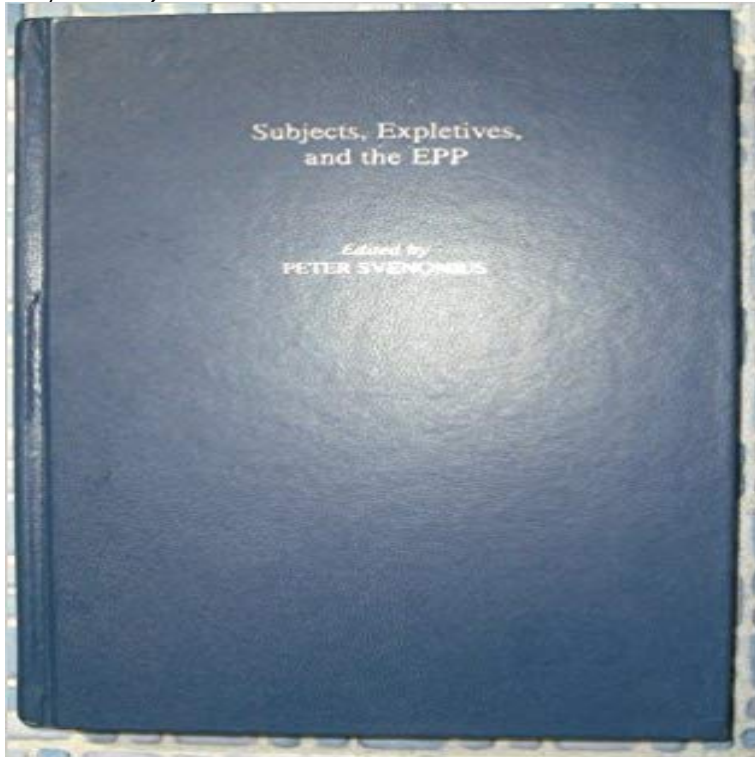


Subjects, Expletives, and the EPP (Oxford Studies in Comparative Syntax)
